ACYPAA BID REQUIREMENTS

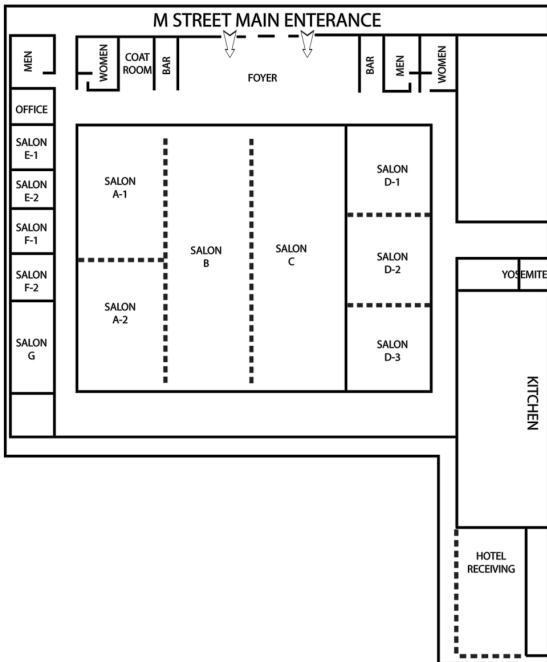
1. The Roundup can be held during the months of February, March, or April.
2. Three AA members, but not limited to three, must represent the bidding group
3. The Bidding Committee must have commitments from at least two (2) meeting facilities (usually hotels), including dates showing availability of banquet and speaking rooms in the facilities. Beverage, banquet, lodging prices, sliding scale, audio/visual costs, and room blocks are to be included in the bid and should be considered when choosing potential sites.
4. Arrangements for uniformed professional security coverage at the Roundup site will be provided by the bid committee's arrangement for a licensed security agency. The description and estimated cost for the security coverage must be included in the bid.
5. The bid committee is to provide a permanent mailing address for the Roundup in the form of a Post Office Box.
6. Two statements of support, one from the local AA Intergroup or regional equivalent and one from the Area Assembly and/or District, are to be included in the bid package.
7. The bid committee will be required to demonstrate its financial capabilities within the Traditions of AA as a whole, being directly involved in any activity from which revenues are generated.
8. The bid committee will provide a list of all large scale AA events in their area within a sixty day period before and a thirty day period after the proposed Roundup date.
9. The new Host City must agree that all proceeds, after expenses and donations to local service structures, are to be turned over to the ACYPAA Advisory Council for distribution. The Host City is permitted to donate up to 20% of the proceeds to their local service structure.
10. Bidding committees are to provide 15 complete copies of their bids to the Advisory Council Chairperson by 3:00 PM the Friday of the Roundup, but no bids will be rejected.
11. The bid committee must provide a concise statement illustrating the need, as they understand it, for the Roundup in their area.
12. Each committee will be given a maximum limit of 20 minutes for the presentation of the Bid Requirements.

NEEDS STATEMENT

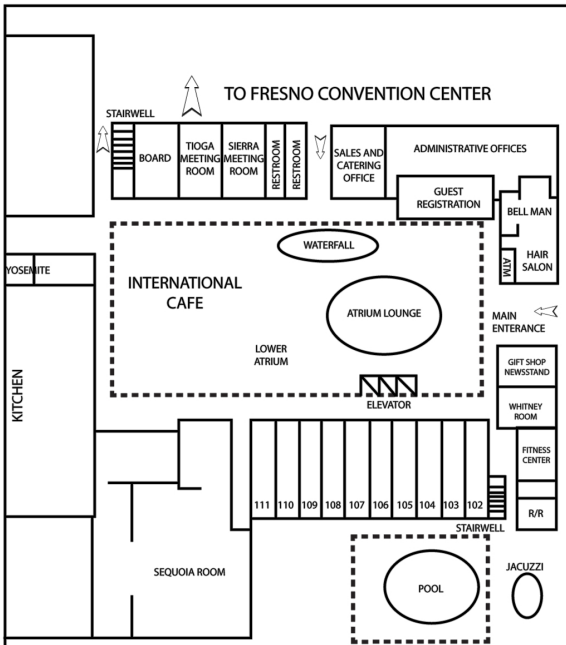
The facts as to why Fresno needs ACYPAA speak loudly. We know that ACYPAA originated in Fresno, we know that it hasn't been here since 1990, and we know that people in Fresno are dying from the disease of alcoholism. But there are reasons we need this Roundup to come to Fresno that aren't so obvious. It's the commonplace things that happen inside the meetings at the Roundup. Someone is stirred by something they hear, whether it's from a panelist with 30 years or if it's in a game of truth in the hospitality room. The spiritual message of hope is heard and that individual takes that message with them everywhere they go from that point forward. So, the Tuesday night meeting in Madera that has 15 members is brought back the message of hope from the 17 year old who was lucky enough to be in that panel, or in that hospitality room. The message is carried from the Radisson in Fresno to Clovis, Tulare, Auberry, Lindsay, Chowchilla, Turlock, Lodi, Manteca, Merced, Visalia, Sanger, Hanford, Mendota, Coarsegold, Pixley, Firebaugh, Parlier, Kerman and to the other 176 cities in the Central Valley, most of which have no idea what young people's AA is. The Central Valley is desperate to get the solution based recovery that an ACYPAA Roundup brings to all who attend. Imagine that single spiritual message of hope and of all the people it could reach that have never heard it before. That's why Fresno needs ACYPAA and that is also why ACYPAA needs us too.

We of Fresno County Young People in AA have survived on faith. Faith that the program of alcoholics anonymous has saved our lives and will continue to do so. Faith that with God's help we will carry the AA message to others as has been done to us. And faith that God will allow us to do that in whatever capacity is needed. We believe that whether or not we "win" ACYPAA, we will remain convicted to our primary purpose of carrying the message. We do it out of the necessity to stay sober, and we do it for Alex, Russ and Qory.

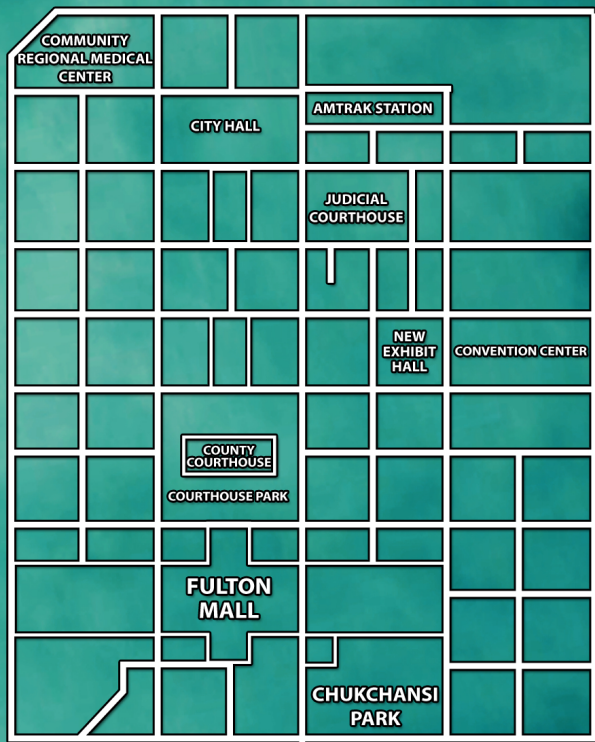
