Greg, our ACYPAA XLV Security Chair, passed away this year in Maui while cave diving with friends. He was 33 years old, and 17 years sober.

For anyone who met him, it is safe to say that he left a strong impression. That was how he lived his life; he attacked everything head on, never holding back, he didn't sugar coat things, he was direct and unapologetic, yet sincere, loving, and always looking out for others. He became a business owner and a homeowner in his early 20's - an amazing feat to accomplish as a young alcoholic, and it put him in a

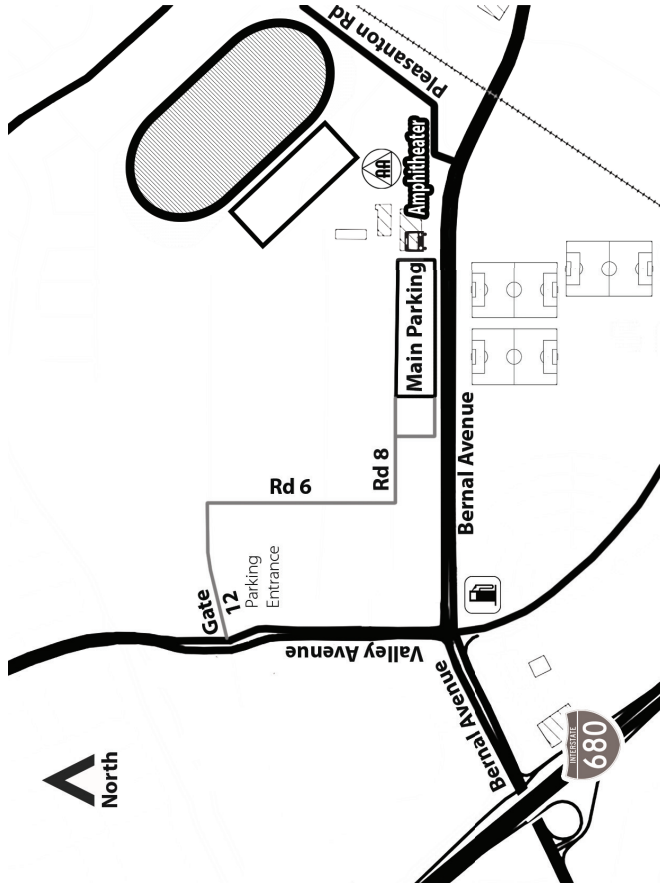
position to be able to help others. He was a friend, a road trip partner, a theme-party lover, an extreme Christmas enthusiast, an outdoorsman, and a dedicated servant to Alcoholics Anonymous. He always had his hand out to alcoholics, helping people realize their dreams, giving people a job or a place to live, saving them from car trouble, consoling them during losses, passing on (sometimes unsolicited) financial advice, he was passionate about so much and he genuinely wanted to share those passions with everyone.

Greg served on MCYPAA (Marin County YPAA) for years and he was the District 10 Special Events coordinator. But it was ACYPAA that really changed the trajectory of his sobriety and service. In 2010, ACYPAA was awarded to a new committee, GGYPAA (Golden Gate YPAA), when Marin and San Francisco Counties came together to bid. He was elected to Co-Facilities Chair for the host committee, and plunged head first into service, he was elected 1st Alternate to the ACYPAA Advisory Council and was able to serve 1 year as a Council Member. He also held a position on the 53rd ICYPAA in 2011, and helped start GGYPAA up in 2012 as a permanent committee. Greg absolutely loved YPAA, he loved the events, conferences, the outreach trips; he was always down for the road trip. Service to ACYPAA changed his life and it's safe to say that he changed ACYPAA and everyone around him for the better. He will be greatly missed by all those whose lives he touched.

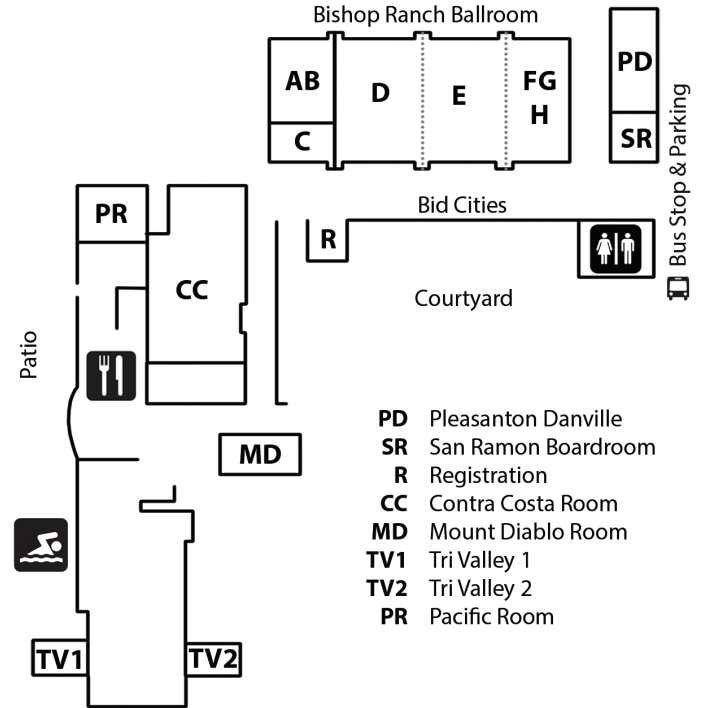

ACYPAA'S FACTS, AIMS, AND PURPOSES

Alcoholism has no barriers, age included. Young people suffering from alcoholism have turned to Alcoholics Anonymous and found help there since AA's earliest days. In 1945, one of the first young people's groups in Alcoholics Anonymous was formed in Los Angeles to help carry the message of recovery to young people in AA.

The number of young people suffering from alcoholism, who turn to AA for help, continues to grow. At the 1960 AA convention, Bill W. noted the age of new members to be much lower in 1960 than when he and Dr. Bob founded AA 25 years earlier. The 2011 AA Membership survey reported 11% of the respondents under 30 years of age and 2% under 21 years of age.

The aim of young people's groups is to help newcomers understand that they need not experience years of drinking, loss of family, friends, and finances to be ready for sobriety. They help bring the newcomers into the mainstream of AA Recovery, Unity, and Service through the 12 Steps, 12 Traditions, and the 12 Concepts for World Service by carrying AA's message to the suffering alcoholic.

Young People's groups are in no way separate from Alcoholics Anonymous as a whole. Members are involved in and committed to Twelfth Step work, Hospital and Institution work, Public Information, General Service, and every other facet of AA Service. Newcomers are shown by people their own age that using AA principles in their daily lives and getting involved in AA Service can lead to a lasting and comfortable sobriety.

The purpose of young people's groups is to carry the Alcoholics Anonymous message to alcoholics no matter what their age.

In 1973, the All California Young People in Alcoholics Anonymous Roundup was established as an annual gathering in California to provide an opportunity for young AAs to come together and share their experience, strength, and hope. ACYPAA is visible evidence that large numbers of people are achieving a lasting and comfortable sobriety in Alcoholics Anonymous. AAs who attend an ACYPAA Roundup return home better prepared to receive young alcoholics who come to AA seeking recovery.

The ACYPAA Roundup is held anywhere in California where young people's groups can demonstrate: 1) the need for an activity like this to stimulate greater involvement and participation by young people in their area; 2) the ability of their group to function responsibly within the principles of Alcoholics Anonymous; and 3) the ability of the group to host a Roundup representative of the diversity of California young people in Alcoholics Anonymous. The ACYPAA Advisory Council selects the site for future ACYPAA Roundups from groups that present formal bids and it has been established as the custodian of the Roundups experience.

If you are a young person in AA where there are few other young people, or if you are a member of a young people's group that is not as active as it might be, it is hoped that you will find encouragement in this message. There are others, like you, who are staying sober in AA and trying to carry AA's message to alcoholics who still suffer, especially young people. INFORMES, OBJETIVOS Y PROPOSITOS DE ACYPAA

El alcoholismo no tiene barreras, incluyendo edad. Los jóvenes que sufren de alcoholismo han recurrido a Alcohólicos Anónimos y han encontrado ayuda desde los primeros días de AA. En 1945, uno de los primeros grupos de jóvenes en Alcohólicos Anónimos fue formado en Los Angeles para ayudar a llevar el mensaje de recuperación a jóvenes en AA.

El número de jóvenes que sufre de alcoholismo y que recurre a AA continúa creciendo. En la convención de AA de 1960, Bill W. notó que la edad de los nuevos miembros era mucho menor en 1960 que cuando él y Dr. Bob habían fundado AA 25 años antes. La encuesta de participantes de AA del 2011 reportó que un 11% de los que respondieron tenía menos de 30 años de edad y un 2% tenía menos de 21 años de edad.

El objetivo de los grupos de jóvenes es ayudar a que los principiantes entiendan que no necesitan experimentar años de alcoholismo, pérdida de familia, amigos y parejas para estar listos para la sobriedad. Estos ayudan a traer a los principiantes a la Recuperación, Unidad y Servicio establecidos de AA a través de los 12 Pasos, 12 Tradiciones y los 12 Conceptos para Servicio Mundial llevando el mensaje de AA a quienes sufren de alcoholismo.

Los grupos de jóvenes no están para nada separados de Alcohólicos Anónimos como entidad total. Los miembros están involucrados y comprometidos al trabajo de 12 Pasos, trabajo de hospital e institución, Información Pública, Servicio General y a cualquier otra faceta del Servicio de AA. Los principiantes ven en personas de su misma edad que el uso de los principios de AA en su vida diaria y el involucrarse en Servicio de AA puede llevar a una sobriedad cómoda y duradera.

El propósito de los grupos de jóvenes es llevar el mensaje de Alcohólicos Anónimos a cualquier alcohólico, sin importar su edad.

En 1973 fue establecida All California Young People in Alcoholics Anonymous Roundup como una junta anual en California para que los jóvenes Alcohólicos Anónimos tuvieran una oportunidad de juntarse y compartir su experiencia, fuerza y esperanza. ACYPAA es evidencia notable que demuestra que grandes números de personas están logrando una sobriedad cómoda y duradera en Alcohólicos Anónimos. Los Alcohólicos Anónimos

que asisten a una ACYPAA Roundup regresan a su hogar mejor preparados para recibir a jóvenes alcohólicos que vienen a AA en búsqueda de recuperación.

La ACYPAA Roundup es llevada a cabo en cualquier lugar de California donde grupos de jóvenes puedan demostrar: 1) la necesidad de una actividad como ésta para estimular una mayor integración y participación de jóvenes en el área; 2) la capacidad de su grupo de funcionar de manera responsable dentro de los principios de Alcohólicos Anónimos; y 3) la capacidad del grupo para ser anfitriones de un representante de Roundup de la diversidad de los jóvenes de California en Alcohólicos Anónimos. La asamblea de consejería de ACYPAA selecciona el sitio para Roundups de ACYPAA futuros entre grupos que presentan licitaciones formales y que se hayan establecido como grupos guardianes de la experiencia de Roundups.

Si eres un joven en AA donde hay pocos jóvenes o si eres miembro de un grupo de jóvenes que no es tan activo como podría ser, esperamos que encuentres aliento en este mensaje. Hay otros, como tú, que se están manteniendo sobrios en AA y que están tratando de llevar el mensaje de AA a alcohólicos que todavía sufren, sobre todo jóvenes. 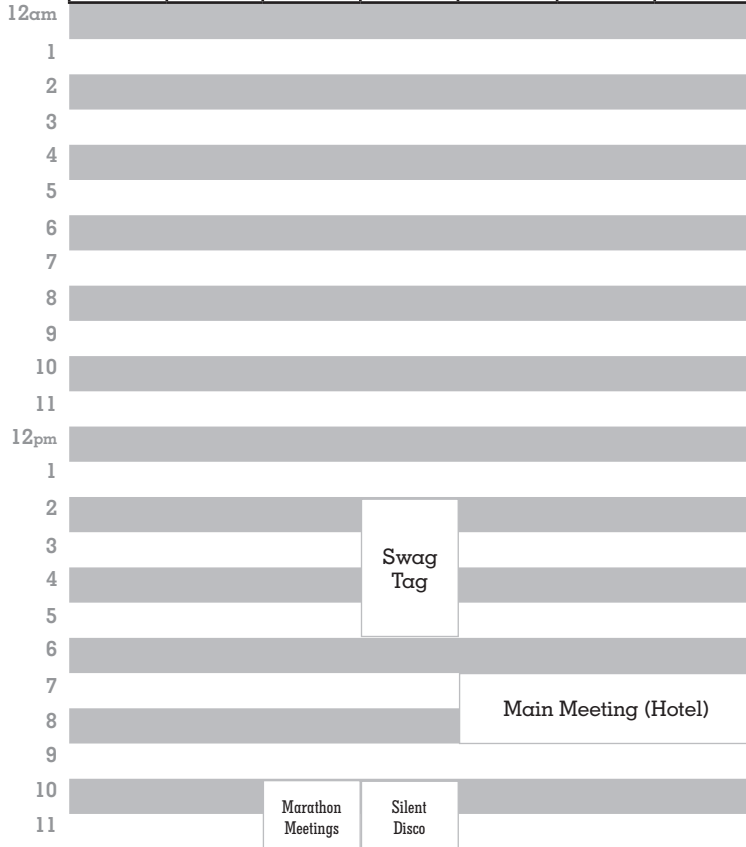

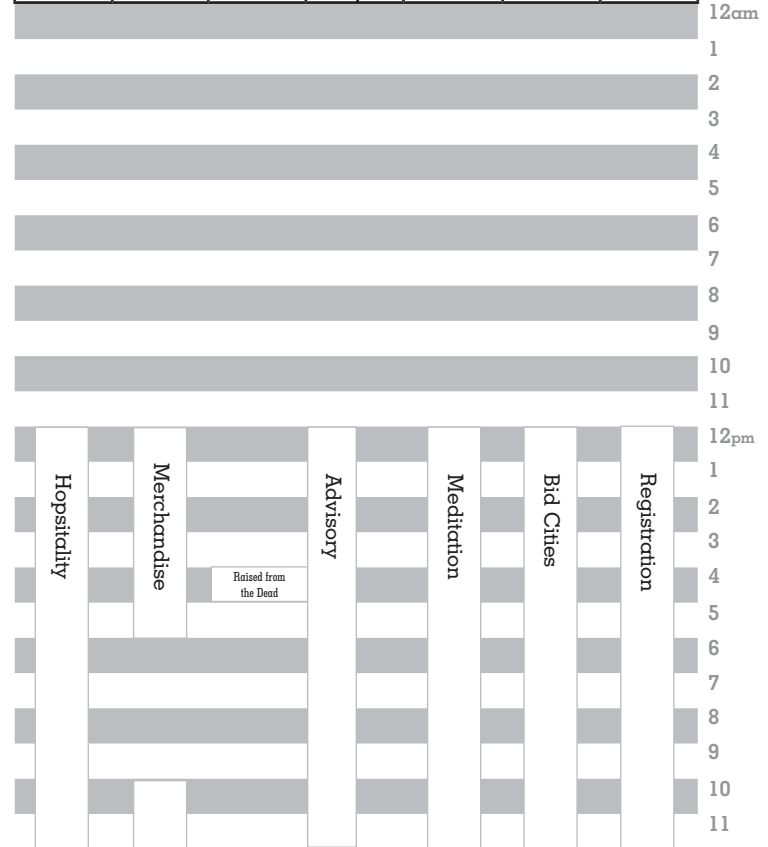

CODE OF CONDUCT POLICIES

Code of Conduct Policies

All California Young People in Alcoholics Anonymous, Inc. (ACYPAA) adheres to the spiritual principles of Alcoholics Anonymous (AA), its 12 steps, Traditions, and Concepts. ACPYPA is committed to an environment that is free from discrimination and harassment. All individuals affiliated with ACPYPA in any way should be personally aware of how their opinions and behaviors can affect people and, in some instances, create a harassing and hostile experience for others. Moreover, all individuals affiliated with ACPYPA are expected to treat each other with dignity and respect. To this end, ACPYPA requires that all Advisory Council members, Host Committee members, Bid Committee members, and general ACPYPA attendees adhere to the policies and guidelines set forth herein, below.

Anti-Harassment

Harassment is defined as unwelcome or unwanted conduct, whether verbal, physical or visual, toward an individual because of their age, race, color, religion, sex, national origin, creed, disability, veteran's status, sexual orientation, gender identity or gender expression, when the conduct creates an intimidating, hostile or offensive environment.

Code of Conduct Enforcement Guidelines

Harassment and sexual harassment are unacceptable at ACPYPA and all related events including, but not limited to, the ACPYPA Facebook page. This behavior violates ACPYPA policies even when it does not constitute a violation of law. If, at any time, an attendee or volunteer believes they have been a victim of or witness to a crime or a violation of this policy, they should report the incident to the ACPYPA Board of Directors, ACPYPA Host Committee, police or hotel staff immediately.

Reporting

Everyone can help ensure that ACPYPA and all related events are free from harassment. Our hope is that any person who finds another's conduct unwelcome will inform that individual directly. We understand this might not always be possible. Therefore, all are encouraged to report conduct they feel is in violation of these policies directly to any member of the ACPYPA Board of Directors or Host Committee. Moreover, any ACPYPA Board of Directors or Host Committee member who is aware of or who receives a report of conduct inconsistent with these guidelines is to report immediately to the ACPYPA Board of Directors or its Authorized Agent(s). These guidelines do not require reporting harassment to, or confronting, any

person responsible for the harassment. If an incident occurs that is in violation of the law, the police will be notified directly.

Investigation

The ACPYPA Board of Directors or its Authorized Agent(s) ("ACYPA Authorized Agent(s)") will promptly investigate and make recommendations to the full ACPYPA Board of Directors regarding all reports describing conduct that is inconsistent with these policies, and will respond to the complainant. During the investigation, confidentiality will be preserved to the extent that the needs of the situation permit. Any illegal conduct will be reported to the appropriate authorities. ACPYPA Authorized Agent(s) may put interim measures in place, which includes but is not limited to a leave of absence and/or directing the potential offender to immediately leave the premises while the investigation takes place. An Elected Officers quorum of 2/3 is required during the investigation. Interim measures can only be put into place by a 2/3 majority vote from a quorum of the Advisory Council Elected Officers. The ACPYPA Authorized Agent(s) are aware that further appropriate action by the full ACPYPA Board of Directors may be necessary once a report has been thoroughly investigated. The investigation may conclude in one of three ways (1) that a violation of policy occurred, (2) that no violation occurred, or (3) that it cannot be determined whether or not a violation occurred. When an investigation reveals that a violation of these policies or other inappropriate conduct has occurred, then ACPYPA's Board of Directors will take corrective action. Corrective action must have a 2/3 majority vote by the ACPYPA Board of Directors. The outcome determination may include consequences as appropriate under the circumstances. This could include, but is not limited to, dismissal, regardless of the service positions held by the parties involved. The Advisory Board of Directors may remove a Board Member via the procedure set forth in its bylaws. The Advisory Board of Directors may also decide to ask any attendee to leave the premises, regardless of whether the conduct amounts to a violation of law. If the person who engaged in conduct that is inconsistent with these policies is not an attendee, then the Advisory Board of Directors will take whatever corrective action is reasonable and appropriate under the circumstances. Making retaliatory threats against a person who assisted in an investigation or reporting, or against a person who directly made a report regarding harassment is also considered a violation of this policy. Any person who experiences or witnesses any conduct they believe to be retaliatory should immediately follow the reporting procedures stated above.
